Report Card on Directive 2024-11: Ohio Secretary of State's Directive to Clean Ohio's Voter Rolls

A Brief Report from the Ohio Election Security Project

Introduction

On June 27, 2024, Ohio Secretary of State Frank LaRose issued <u>Directive 2024-11</u>, introducing a new Registration Audit Dashboard for all Ohio county boards of elections. By August 1, 2024, county boards were required to use this dashboard to review and resolve identified issues. Boards were instructed to access the dashboard at least once per week and correct any flagged voter records. The directive mandated that boards maintain their voter registration databases to ensure flagged voter records do not exceed 0.1% of the total active and active-confirmation status records.

The Ohio Election Security Project compared the state of voter rolls on June 1, 2024 (pre-directive) with August 3, 2024 (post-deadline). Our findings for each required check are presented below.

Prohibited Name Characters

Overall Grade: B+

Honorable Mention: Butler, Clark, Delaware, Fairfield, Franklin, Geauga, Hamilton, Licking, Mahoning, Summit

Underperforming Counties: Montgomery, Madison, Morrow

Chapter 4 of the Secretary of State's Election Official Manual outlines data entry standards for voter names, prohibiting characters such as hyphens, apostrophes, and periods. The dashboard flags names containing these characters for correction.

Statewide, prohibited character violations decreased by 89%, from 3,505 to 374 records. However, Montgomery County's violations increased from 245 to 289, while Madison and Morrow counties also saw increases. Several counties earned honorable mention for resolving 50 or more issues.

Inconsistent Birthdates and Registration Dates

Date of Birth and Registration Date are crucial identifying information. The dashboard flags inconsistencies in these fields, which likely stem from data entry errors. Four issue types were identified: placeholder birth dates, registration before birth, registration under 17, and unreasonably high age.

Placeholder Birth Dates

Overall Grade: F

Honorable Mention: None

Underperforming Counties: Shelby, Mahoning, Hamilton

Prior to the centralized database, some registrations used placeholder dates (e.g., January 1, 1800) for illegible or incomplete records. The Election Official's Manual requires reviewing and correcting these entries.

Statewide, only 51% of the 383 placeholder birthdates were resolved. Hamilton county corrected 103 of their 154 placeholder birth dates. Shelby County increased violations from 8 to 9, while Mahoning County resolved only 1 of 19 flagged records. Hamilton County resolved only 66% of its issues.

Registration Before Birth

Overall Grade: A- (excluding 1/1/1900 placeholder dates)

Honorable Mention: Cuyahoga, Trumbull

Underperforming Counties: Montgomery, Morrow

Records where the Registration Date precedes the Birth Date decreased from 132 to 13 statewide. However, over 51,000 records with 1/1/1900 placeholder registration dates remain, with only 762 resolved between 6/1/24 and 8/3/24. Including these placeholder registration dates would result in an F grade. Trumbull county resolved all 38 issues. Cuyahoga County resolved all but one of the 44 records with a registration date that precedes a birth date.

Registration Under 17

Overall Grade: F

Honorable Mention: None

Underperforming Counties: Montgomery, Summit, Madison, Franklin

Records indicating voter registration before age 17 (the minimum eligible age) saw a 59% resolution rate, with 1,002 of 1,689 flagged records addressed. Including 1/1/1900 placeholder dates, 51,845 records remain to be reviewed. While Cuyahoga County resolved 130 of 131 cases of registration under 17 years of age, they are the primary offender of using a 1/1/1900 placeholder registration date.

Unreasonably High Age

Overall Grade: D

Honorable Mention: Richland

Underperforming Counties: Montgomery, Mahoning, Franklin

Records showing voters aged 110 or older were resolved at a 64% rate (66 of 103 records). Montgomery and Mahoning counties did not resolve any issues, while Franklin and Cuyahoga counties addressed relatively few. Richland County resolved all 15 cases of voters with unreasonable ages.

Conclusion

While some progress has been made in cleaning Ohio's voter rolls, significant work remains. The 0.1% error rate allowed by Secretary LaRose's directive leaves hundreds of errors unaddressed and causing the overall effort to earn a failing grade. Montgomery County failed to resolve enough issues to meet the 0.1% error rate. As a result, the overall effectiveness of the activity across the state was sorely lacking. Given that local election contests are often decided by just a few votes, more stringent efforts and oversight are necessary to ensure the integrity of Ohio's voter registration data.
